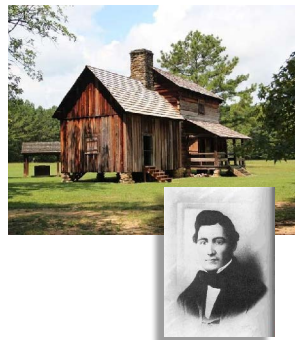


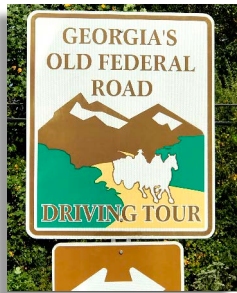
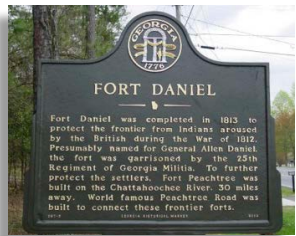


Flowery Branch

1805
Vann's Tavern and ferry crossing the Chattahoochee River was established in 1805 by Chief Hames Vann as an integral part of the early transportation network of the Flowery Branch region.



1813
The U.S. Government undertook the construction of a roadway (following old Native American trails) extending from North Georgia to points south (Augusta and Macon) and north to Tennessee.



1818
While en route to Spanish West Florida to engage in the First Seminole War, General Andrew Jackson, his staff and two companies of militia lodged at Young's Tavern on the Old Federal Road, now state Route 13 (Falcon Parkway) near its intersection with Hog Mountain Road.

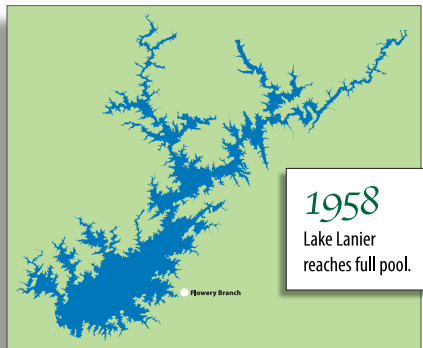
1874
Flowery Branch was incorporated.

There are two opinions about how the name, Flowery Branch was derived. Annaguluskee is an Indian name and means "flowers on the branch." Nattagasskais also an Indian name and means "blossom creek." At one time Flowery Branch was the site of an early Indian trading post.

The Georgia Shoe Mfg. Co. is established in Flowery Branch, and employed 850 people. It manufactured 7,000 pairs of shoes a day. There were two plants, two warehouses and one main office located in Flowery Branch.



1958
Lake Lanier reaches full pool.

1985
Flowery Branch is added to The National Register of Historic Places.

2005
Flowery Branch becomes the home the NFL Atlanta Falcons football team.



2020
Population of Flowery Branch reaches 9,391.
